What is Key Word Sign?

Key Word Sign is a simplified form of manual signing. It is used by people who have communication difficulties and the people around them.

Key Word Sign uses Auslan signs borrowed from the Australian Deaf community.

When using Key Word Sign we speak, and sign the key words of our message. Key Word Sign can be used by children and adults who have difficulties that might include:

- paying attention and using eye contact
- understanding what people say to them
- communicating with speech

Key Word Sign is also used by people in their community, home, school or work place who might interact and sign with them.

How do I learn Key Word Sign?

Key Word Sign NSW train presenters to deliver Key Word Sign Basic Workshops.
